While we explored opportunities for a sustainable collaboration with the government — with the goal of expanding our long-term impact — this year we concentrated on concrete initiatives that make an immediate difference.

The medical campaigns we organized specifically focused on maternity care and gender-based violence. These topics are not always adequately addressed by the existing healthcare system, partly due to the taboos that still surround them. For that very reason, we saw it as our responsibility to raise awareness and provide accessible care around these issues.

The campaigns were a great success, attracting hundreds of visitors who made use of the care, education, and support offered. Thanks to the dedication of local professionals,



volunteers, and our collaboration with the hospital in Kahama, we were able to reach many people and truly make a difference.

We are deeply grateful for the trust and support of our donors and partners. Together, we continue to build a future where healthcare is accessible to everyone — including those affected by vulnerable or underrepresented issues.

Thanks to a donation from Makaye Infosec, we organized a medical camp focused on raising awareness about non-communicable diseases. During this camp, we screened 461 people and provided them with necessary medication.

Additionally, we received a donation from BOOKS4LIFE in Nijmegen, which allowed us to secure a significant amount of funding for a mobile clinic. This clinic is intended to visit people at home and provide the care they need.
